Dear Grazebrook Families,

Charity and Harvest: Kindness and Collaboration

This half term, as part of our work around our values of kindness and collaboration, the KS1 and KS2 children have been exploring the UN Convention on the Rights of a Child, Article 28: the right to an education; Article 27: the right to a sufficient standard of living and Article 24: the right to good health and healthcare. This week we have held assemblies on Harvest and the work of Hackney Food Bank and Charity and the work of Save the Children.

If you are able to, we are asking all our families to donate one item of non-perishable food or hygiene products such as: breakfast cereal, rice, pasta, tinned fruit or vegetables, handsoap, toothpaste, long-life juice, teabags, biscuits and cans of baked beans, tinned spaghetti or soup. Children can give this to their class teacher or items can be dropped off at the table in the school reception area. The items will then be delivered to Hackney Foodbank at the end of the half term.

We are also asking for donations of small change to raise funds for Save the Children to support their aim of helping children across the world have access to an education, healthcare, shelter and food. The donation box can be found on the reception front desk. Every £10 we raise could pay for malnutrition food sachets, maize seed, water purification tablets, cholera antibiotic tablets or go towards resourcing a temporary classroom or medical centre to allow children who are not able to access school to receive an education.
